DOG FOULING – A PUBLIC CONSULTATION

People have strong views about dogs; whether they are about dog's mess on pavements and playing fields, or about the rights of dog owners to exercise their dogs. Any changes to dog controls need consultation with the public.

Canvey Island Town Council is considering introducing dog control orders (under the Clean Neighbourhoods and Environment Act 2005) on the seafront path from Thorney Bay to Chapman Sands. We need your views on these proposals.

These orders would require dog owners to clear up after their dogs, i.e. remove dog faeces from the ground. Other powers do exist, which include banning dogs, requiring dogs to be on a lead and restricting the number of dogs under the control of a person. There is no intention to ban dogs from the area, what we want is a clean area, free from dog mess and other litter.

The Town Council would like your views on this proposal and we want to hear from as many people as possible. You are welcome to comment on the other powers and other areas of Canvey and all views will be taken into account.

We have not drafted any dog control orders as yet as we want to ensure that any proposals are supported by local residents. If we then decide to try and implement dog control orders we will have to go through a Formal Consultation Process as prescribed in the Act and Regulations.

FISHING AT CANVEY LAKE

The Canvey Island Coarse Anglers have decided to withdraw from the Fishing Licence agreement, with effect from 31st May 2010.

Contrary to rumour, the Town Council does not wish to ban fishing at Canvey Lake. There is a great deal of work to be done, to repair the damage that years of neglect have brought about and the Council will be seeking expert advice about dredging the lake, as

a matter of priority. This cannot be carried out until the nesting and breeding season is over and it will be necessary to seek funding to complete this work, but it is hoped to improve the quality of the water and to create new swims.

The Town Council is seeking a full time or two part time water bailiffs to oversee fishing at the lake and anyone interested is asked to
